

CENTIPEDE

Eremochloa ophiuroides



Centipede originated from China & Southeast Asia and was introduced into the United States in 1916. A warm season, low maintenance turfgrass that is well suited for the Southeast United States. Centipede is sensitive to alkaline soils and hard frost, which limits its growing area to the Carolina's through to the gulf coast of Texas. When planted in frost free areas, Centipede will grow year round. Uses include lawns, parks, roadsides and cemeteries.

Centipede is slow to germinate, establishes & fills in via stolons and has a shallow root system. The shallow root system makes winter overseeding difficult which can cause the plant to weaken and die. During low rainfall, subsequent watering is required as centipede is not a drought tolerant plant. Plant in full to partial shade during spring once there is active growth. Centipede has low fertility requirements once fully established. Keep mowed to a height of 1 1/2—2 inches.

Available in Raw & Coated Seeds

Raw Seed— 450,000 Seeds per pound

Coated Seed— 225,000 Seeds per pound. Has been coated with a clay based material with trace nutrients to increase successful germination by providing nutrients at the time of germination.

Planting Rates

Raw Seed: 1/4 lb. per 1000 sq. ft.

Coated Seed: 1/2 lb. per 1000 sq ft
