

Crimson Clover

Trifolium incarnatum



Crimson clover

A winter annual that can be used for erosion control, habitat and landscaping. Seed early enough in the fall for establishment before frost for weed control. Crimson clover's primary advantage is that it grows fast during cool weather, shade tolerance and a positive reseeding potential. It can be planted in the spring or fall for weed control, or overseeded in corn at second cultivation or in soybeans at leaf drop. Spring seeding provides good cover, but not as many blooms. Crimson clover has bright crimson, cylindrical shaped heads.
